Curriculum Intent Statement

At Oasis Academy Enfield and Hadley the Drama curriculum is designed to allow students to gain a detailed knowledge of Drama and Theatre. - Includes learning about Suffragettes, Tiananmen Square, MeToo, Black Lives Matter and other human rights issues
- Development of skills from Year 8 using multimedia (documentaries, film-making)
- Presentation of films to parents/community
