NEU STRIKE – THURSDAY, 2ND MARCH 2023

I hope this email finds you and your family healthy and well.

I am sorry to be writing to you again about teacher strike days that are affecting us being open for all children on Thursday, 2nd March 2023.

The teacher strikes are happening because of a national dispute between the unions and the government over funding for schools and teachers’ pay, and not because of any issues here at Hadley.

Unfortunately, we will not be able to have all children in school as we will have less teachers in site than we usually do. I want to ensure the children and safe and well cared for.

On **Thursday 2nd March**, the arrangements for each year group are below:

Breakfast club and after school club will operate as usual for the year groups that are in school only.

On the day the children will be engaged in a mixture of learning activities that are engaging, interesting and fun but may be slightly different than the usual day. Lunch arrangements remain the same. The only exception will be for Year 11s who will finish slightly earlier at 2pm.

We do have a limited number of additional spaces for children whose year groups are not in school and you are worried about your children remaining at home, please contact the main reception on 0208 804 6946 or email the Academy Office academyoffice@oasishadley.org by 10am on Tuesday, 28th February 2023

All children who are remaining at home should complete the work in their independent learning folder on their iPad.

I understand that this situation may be frustrating for parents, we are doing all we can to have children in school however this industrial action is not within our control. If there are any changes to the arrangements, I will of course let you know as soon as possible.
