- Encourage use of Spelling Shed, Maths Shed and SUMDOG free online education games daily.
- Check that your child is accessing Microsoft Teams regularly for home learning tasks and messages from teachers
- Promote independence by encouraging your child to be active learners, remembering
 to bring in their PE kits every <u>Friday</u> and ensuring that their homework is completed
 every week by Tuesday.
- Ensure your child is punctual and is in every day.
