## Reception Curriculum Spring 2 2023

We do hope you had a lovely break! Both UCLA and Bristol University enjoyed learning about their topic 'Homes'. The children particularly enjoyed drawing the houses in the local community. Their next topic is 'People who help us'. During this topic, the children will be learning about people who help us and how their roles have changed over time.
