The SATs are a snapshot of what your child has learnt in primary school and the results will reflect this. The teachers that work with your children, say that each child has made fantastic progress this academic year. We are proud of the hard work and resilience they have shown in preparing for the tests.

SATS Timetable

It is essential that your child attends school every day for every test

Monday 13 ^h May 2024	Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar: Paper 1- Short Answer (45 minutes) Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar: Paper 2- Spelling Test (15 minutes)
Tuesday 14 th May 2024	Reading (1 hour)
Wednesday 15 th May 2024	Maths Paper 1: Arithmetic (30 minutes) Maths Paper 2: Reasoning (40 minutes)
Thursday 16 th May 2024	Maths Paper 3: Reasoning (40 minutes)

How will Key Stage 2 SATs be marked?

All the test papers are sent away to be marked. Children will be given standardised scores for Reading, Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar and Maths. To achieve the expected standard at the end of Key Stage 2 your child will need to achieve a standardised score of 100. Results will be shared with parents in the end of year report.

How will my child be assessed in writing?

Writing is teacher assessed using descriptors set by the government. In order to achieve the expected standard, children's work must show examples of all of the descriptors in samples of their writing.
